Grace UMC future pastor named

Bishop Leonard Fairley of the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church has announced that the Rev. Benton W. "Benny" Oakes will be the new senior pastor of Grace United Methodist Church in Wilmington.

Oakes will succeed the Rev. Tal Madison, who is retiring. His appointment begins June 29. Oakes is currently senior pastor of First United Methodist Church in Elizabeth City.

A native of the Raleigh-Durham area, Oakes had a business career before answering the call to ministry. He holds a Master of Divinity degree from Duke University and is pursuing a doctorate in ministry through Duke's off-campus program.

Oakes and his wife Monica have four children, one of whom still lives at home. He and Harbor District Superintendent Tara Lain visited Grace last week and met with members of the Staff-Parish Relations Committee.

Confirmation Class Continues

Pastors Tal and Patricia will offer a four session Confirmation Class for youth who are rising 6th graders and older. The class is designed for those interested in being confirmed as full members of Grace UMC. This class will continue in W202 (Wesleyan Classroom in Walsh Hall) May 1, (skip Mother's Day May 8), May 15, and May 22 (four sessions).

Upcoming topics:

Session 2 -- (May 1, taught by Tal) -- New birth -what does it mean? How do I get it? Also baptism and the Lord's Supper - what do they mean? (Skip May 8, Mother's Day)

Session 3 -- (May 15, taught by Tal) John Wesley and the rise of Methodism. What does being a Methodist mean?

Session 4 -- (May 22, taught by Patricia) church membership -- what are we committing to when we become a member of a UM Church? What are we promising to do when we join? What does the church promise to us?

Important notes for parents:

Once youth are confirmed, they become full members of Grace United Methodist Church.

In the United Methodist Church, baptism is required for membership. Therefore, any youth who want to become full members will need to be baptized. If any were baptized as infants, they meet this requirement for membership and will not be rebaptized. If they were baptized in another denomination, so long as they were baptized in the name of Jesus, they meet this requirement and will not be rebaptized.

In the UMC, we only baptize someone once in their life. If someone is baptized at any point in their life, even as an infant, they are then not rebaptized at confirmation or at any other point in their life. People can retake their baptismal vows as often as they like, but they do not have the waters of baptism placed on them ever again. God got it right the first time.

As part of the confirmation service, only those who have not received baptism will be baptized. It will be explained to the congregation why some are being baptized and others are not.

Youth taking part are highly encouraged to attend all four classes.

Confirmation, taking vows of membership in the church, is a big deal! My approach has always been to not pressure young ones to take the vows of membership. The decision to take the vows of membership is most impactful when it is freely chosen.

Study On UM Stance on LGBTQ Matters

The United Methodist Church is reviewing its stand on ordination of LGBTQ+ persons and performing marriages for same gender persons. We'll offer a study on this matter this spring, beginning late April.

This study, led by Tal, will explore the scriptures that speak overtly to this matter. We'll see why Christians read these passages in differing ways. The goal of this study is not to tell you what to think, but to give you tools to clarify your own thinking. Be advised that this class will deal with adult topics.

We will also look at the leading proposal being brought before General Conference regarding these matters. What decisions will each church have to make? When will they have to make them?

This study builds across five sessions, each about an hour in length. It will be offered both on Sunday evenings and Tuesday mornings.

Sunday evening sessions will be offered at 5:10 pm on April 24, May 1, May 15, May 22, and May 29. (Note: we will skip May 8 for Mother's Day.) Childcare will be provided by the Children's Ministry as they meet on Sundays during this time.

Tuesday morning sessions will meet at 9:30 am on April 26, May 3, May 17, May 24, and May 31. (Note we skip May 10.) No childcare will be offered for the Tuesday sessions.

The expectation is that participants will discuss these matters while respecting one another's viewpoints.

Did You Know?

After the rebuilding, Grace's membership grew. The E.L. White education wing was constructed, adding a fellowship hall, kitchen, parlor, office area on the first floor, and additional classroom space on the second floor.

In 1960, the Atlantic Coastline moved its headquarters to Jacksonville, Florida. That move took many of our active young families.

Grace struggled to keep pace with our demands. By 1966, Wilmington began to grow. Soon new commercial plants and businesses moved to the area with large numbers of employees and their families. Grace gained new members and new life. In 1968, with the union of The Methodist Church and The Evangelical United Brethren Church, the name of our church became Grace United Methodist Church. A new change came to the church in 1998 with the merger of Sunset Park United Methodist Church and Grace United Methodist Church. The latest addition to Grace was the construction of the John Bullock Activity building. This addition added the Welcome Center, kitchen, storage areas, restrooms, and an office complex on the second floor. The old fellowship hall and kitchen were converted to the Music Suite; housing the Music Director's office, music library, bell choir, chancel choir rehearsal rooms, and robe rooms.

The past 225 years have not been easy for the "Mother Church of Methodism" in Wilmington. Grace UMC has proven that by witnessing through meaningful worship services, an excellent music program and never changing and growing children and youth programs, and a far-reaching mission program many lives have been touched by this church.

Grace will celebrate its 225th anniversary on Dec. 24th, 2022.
