Welcome, Warming Shelter!

'Welcoming the stranger' is one of the blessings God credits people for doing in Scripture (Mt 25:35). Elsewhere, we are taught there is no distinction in our behavior toward neighbor or stranger (Lev 19:33-36). We love neighbors and strangers as ourselves. Friends, all of this is a gift from God, and we have been given an opportunity to practice this hospitality, loving our neighbors as ourselves, through the Warming Shelter ministry!

The Warming Shelter ILM is, "... a triage effort for the unhoused – an emergency, overnight, pop-up shelter on cold nights" (from their website). The Warming Shelter began as a ministry of The Anchor in 2017, and has grown into an ecumenical effort to offer a safe, warm, food-filled environment that leads to restful slumber for our unhoused neighbors during nights when the cold weather is potentially life threatening.

Last year, our sister church, Trinity UMC, offered their space for the Warming Shelter, however, they are unable to participate this winter season, due to some building renovations that are underway. After conversations with their co-director, Meg McBride, pastor of Hope Recovery UMC in Wilmington, as well as a unanimous approval by our Administrative Council at Grace UMC, we are pleased to announce that Grace UMC will host the Warming Shelter this winter season in the Bullock Activity Center!

The Warming Shelter has a full slate of volunteers and plenty of what they need to serve our neighbors during the frigid nights of the year, and they would also love any help and support we offer them along the way. For those interested in learning more about this ministry Grace will be hosting, you are invited to attend an informational session, along with training, on December 17th, at 9:45 am, in the Bullock Activity Center.
