Warming Shelter Update—will open 1/7—1/11

In Dec. 2024, The Warming Shelter was open 11 days before Dec 25th - we cleaned up the shelter with about 30 volunteers on Christmas Eve morning. Last season (23/24), we saw a drastic increase in our number of guests - sheltering 50% more people than we did in previous years. Our initiative is quickly growing in demand/need and we are navigating that growth organizationally. Each time we are open, we reevaluate and refine our process. We discuss capacity along with what is reasonably possible for a church ministry. In December 2024, being open both around the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays was a blessing as we had a great number of volunteers that helped us to fully staff the shelter. We are deeply grateful to 86 Hunger Now who helped us tremendously with food preparation! The donations of snacks, soda, coffee, personal items and blankets was incredible and when we asked for specific items, people responded! We were able to meet almost every request for clothing items because of your help! Because of the massive effort it takes to both open and close the temporary shelter and cover shelter hours with volunteer staff, going forward in 2025, we will open the shelter when the temperature is expected to drop below 30 degrees on any 3 consecutive nights.

Remember: One weather source is used to make our determinations: www.weather.gov and consultation with the Wilmington office of the National Weather Service. As we continue to grow, we are taking steps to bring more structure to our initiative in the coming months. Our hope is that in 2025 we can make these dreams come true:

- Hire paid staff who can devote 100% of their time and attention to this work
- Submit Applications for Grant Funding
- Continue to explore the possibility of hosting cooling shelters in the summer
- Continue to support the other year-round efforts such as Living Hope Day Center, The Anchor's Sunday Breakfast on the Riverwalk and our Mobile Shower Trailer, along with the @Cape Fear Homeless Continuum of Care, who fosters collaborative work among all the local homeless service providers to bring an end to homelessness.

We could NOT do this work without the help, commitment and compassion of many, many volunteers and supporters who have given generously in so many ways. We are so, so, so grateful for how connecting and working around shared values and a common cause has created such a beautiful community of love, belonging and friendship.
