

By now most of us have seen the images that have flooded in from the western part of our state and many have asked about how to help. Many of you have already donated funds to Grace with Hurricane Helene or UMCOR in the memo line. Thank you, those funds are being directed to most impacted counties in Western NC through the Western Conference! Here are a few other ways Grace and our community is supporting Hurricane Helene

Cleaning Buckets:

Bring in cleaning supplies that will get sorted and put in buckets, or join with friends an fill one based on the UMCOR list at this link: https://nccumc.org/ disaster/kits/cleaning/ Some empty buckets are available in the Welcome Center and it also is ok to fill a used bucket, as long as it has a handle and lid. A small supply of leather



palmed gloves have been donated as well as N-95 masks.

The cleanup portion will be continuing on for months so, if we run out of buckets this weekend, there will be more coming soon. You don't need to add a \$3 check for shipping to the bucket as it is indicated on the back of the list, as they will be delivered. And, if you unable to get all items listed, just note the missing items.

Personal items for App State students:

Also, because of a relationship with Appalachian Wesley Foundation, we have a more immediate opportunity to help App State students recover.

As mentioned in the previous two newsletters the ASU Wesleyan mission team was planning on staying with us to serve in mission with Wilmington Area Rebuilding Ministry. They have had to cancel their trip for now, so that they can help their own students and community. This group is requesting new packages of underwear, socks, twin and full sheet sets and blankets. This collection will be in a bin in the Welcome Center near the elevator.
